Robert Olislageers, Executive Director, Centennial Airport gave an excellent talk titled “Drone or Not to Drone.” There are four concerns with unmanned aerial vehicles, UAVs, They are the myriad of applications drones can be used, anywhere from agriculture to looking at real estate. Another concern is privacy. The fourth is safety followed by security.

The FAA has come out with rules for drones that weight between 0.55 and 55 pounds. Those under the minimum weight do not have to be registered. Those above 55 pounds are not considered recreational. Recreational drones cannot fly within 5 miles of a airport or helipad. They must give way to aircraft and fly below 400 ft above ground level. All recreational drones must be registered and have their FAA marking.
