Evan Bunch, the January Student of the Month, receives his plaque. Evan has maintained a 3.6 average at Arapahoe HS. He is a member of the National Honor Society. From 2014 through 2016 he has played varsity soccer. He is the tea captain, is on the 2016 1st team all state, and the Centennial league player of the year. He is a member of the Arapahoe Singers and was in 15 concerts in December, alone.

He plans on attending Mesa and then transfer to the U of C Boulder to major in Mechanical Engineering.



John Wiebenge was the speaker and the title of his speech was "Cancer is not a Four Letter Word." Ten years ago John was diagnosed with an aggressive form of prostate cancer and was not expected to live 5 years. He had robotic surgery, but the robot broke halfway through the surgery. Next he had proton beam radiation treatment in conjunction with chemo therapy. It did not work. Afterwards he found out there was a Chemo Sensitive Test that tests various chemo therapies against a culture of his specific tumor. All in all, western medicine was a failure. John talked a book by Suzanne Sommers titled "Knockout: Interviews with Doctors Who Are Curing Cancer—And How to Prevent it in the First Place."

John eventually found a biochemist in San Diego that developed a special protocol for him. The protocol takes a holistic approach for curing cancer. For John he went through an IR sauna which is a form of detoxification of the body. He has been taking bee pollen, cayenne pepper and turmeric.

Needless to say, since John was presenting his story 10 years after he was diagnosed and 5 years after he was supposed to be dead, the approach he has taken works.

John advocates being your own advocate and to challenge your doctors.
