Eric Hauff, along with giving his classification talk also presented the club with a flag from the Singapore Rotary club.

Eric is from Chicago. His father was from the Ukraine and taught Germanic languages at the University of Chicago. Eric's father escaped from the Ukraine to escape the Stalin purges. At 3 years of age, his father moved the family to Boulder so he could teach Germanic languages at the University of Colorado.

Is senior year in high school, Eric ended up living in Germany, next to the East German border. He was there during the height of the cold war and saw the spy versus spy goings on. He enrolled in the University of Colorado, but it didn't last very long. After dropping out of CU he spoke to the CIA about getting a job. They told him he needed an engineering degree or a degree in chemistry. He didn't have the drive to do that so he joined the Air Force to see about becoming a linguist. He was assigned to air borne reconnaissance and sent to Alaska. He ended up getting an assignment in Germany eventually doing émigré debriefing. He was taught Yugoslavian and was recruited into the Air Force Special Operations doing work in Bosnia.

After the Air Force Eric joined the Sierra Nevada Corp, a defense corporation where he is director of international sales. He is also active in the Colorado Civil Air Patrol.
