It is important for others for you to like yourself more. If you like yourself more it will show in how you treat your employees and others. One thing is to not beat yourself up over things you might do. If you are beating yourself up, it is difficult to be nice to others.

Listening to others is important. If you listen to others, they will feel they are being heard and what they have to say is important. It validates and shows you have value in their opinion. Look at the individual when they are talking, but it is not a stare down situation. It shows acknowledgment of what they are saying.

Being open to learning shows the other person you are interested in what they are saying. Ask questions.
